Principal's Message

Partners in Learning

Your child's teacher is the most important in-school influence on your child's educational success.

Evidence shows that children's positive interactions with teachers strengthen all aspects of their development, including language, cognition and social-emotional skills, regardless of their age, gender, race, ethnic, language and income level. However, the quality of children's relationships with their teacher varies among individuals, even in the same classroom.

An import factor is children are more likely to be engaged in the classroom and motivated to learn when they trust that their teacher will provide comfort, encouragement and emotional support. Some teachers may provide more support and attention to children with whom they have a close and conflict-free relationship, which in turn, can deeply influence children's school readiness and adjustment. If the teacher-child relationship is perceived as unsupportive or negative, it may lead children to disengage from the enriching instruction happening in the classroom and reduce their interactions with others.

Your child's teacher will take time to get to know your child well. Relationships for learning are important to us here at St Brigid's. Your child is more likely to make progress and succeed when the partnership between school and home is positive. If you have any aspect of your child's learning or wellbeing at school that you need to talk about, please do arrange a time to meet with your child's teacher in the first instance.


