

We have been doing all sorts of exciting learning in Room 2 over the past few weeks. The students have been hard at work practising for the school production.

As always, if children need relief of pain parents can call Donna on 4797189 and she will arrange for one of our staff to see them. If Donna cannot be reached please phone 4798889 and leave a message for her to call them.

Donna will be on holiday leave from Friday 20 December 2019 until Monday 20 January 2020 - during this time parents may bring children to the walk in clinic on the first floor of the School of Dentistry for relief of pain.

The main door will usually open at 8:30 am – the hours for clinics and the times the main doors close during the holiday season are as follows:
