
Promoting Interfaith Relations In Aotearoa New Zealand

Introducing the revised booklet Thursday 16th of May, 6.00pm St Patrick's Basilica, Macandrew Rd, Dunedin

The New Zealand Catholic Bishops Committee for Interfaith Relations (NZCBCIR) have created a booklet to encourage and support people in engaging with interfaith dialogue. This booklet is specifically designed to help Catholics who may be wondering what this is all about.

The booklet was written well before March 15th, but the content is particularly poignant in the light of the terrible deeds of that day, and the powerful response throughout the nation afterwards.

Please, come along to St Patrick's on the 16th of May where Bishop Michael and Colin MacLeod, both members of the NZCBCIR, will introduce the booklet and provide you with a copy.



Muslims, Christians & Jews - "People of the Book"

The terrible events of March 15th, and the powerful response throughout the nation afterwards, drew particular attention to the reality that Muslim people are our neighbours. For Catholic Christians the relationship is even closer, because Muslims, and Jews, believe in the same God that we do – and we teach this in our schools.

There are many differences in understandings, customs and expressions of faith, so come along and find out about some of them as Colin MacLeod, Director of the National Centre for Religious Studies, shares what the Catholic Secondary Religious Education programme teaches about us – together - as People of the Book. Parents and Grandparents of children of all ages and any parishioners interested in this topic will find these sessions valuable.
