The first challenge of the day was to make a bridge using paper, glue, masking tape and I skewer





COSTS: \$90 hr + GST: Good lining \$15 a metre and tape \$2.70

The Charity: The Dunedin Curtain Bank receives good quality unused or unwanted curtains which are distributed to those most in need; Community Service Card holders and Gold Card holders with CSC status. We line the curtains of the main heat source room, the bedrooms of children and all the curtains in the house for people with severe health issues. The Dunedin Curtain Bank has been established since 2013 and in that time we have given over 3000 curtains.

With our work we also save up to 6 ton of fabric from landfill annually. We train youth machinists, students and volunteers to go back into the workforce.

We also have an ENVIROSHOP where we sell beautiful bags fashioned from vintage fabric/curtain offcuts.
